

Treasurer's Report: The October Treasurer's Report was reviewed and discussed. Bob made a motion to approve the October Treasurer's Report. Eileen seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

- On October 30, 2023, the 9-month CD matured and \$22,879.47 was reinvested in a 7-month CD that will mature on May 31, 2024. The interest rate is 4.770%.
- Dustin and Diane will set the amount to be held on the First Farmers and Merchants Bank church debit card. Limited funds will be available in the account to be used for church items.
- Received \$12,500 in contributions to date for the building repair fund.

Council Minutes continued.

Correspondence:

- Pastor Jan read an email from Kirby Hurd, Grant Director at CADA House, thanking Zion UCC for their support.
- Ruth Circle is raising funds in November to donate to CADA.

Pastor Jan's Report:

- The Confirmation Class had a field trip to Feed My Starving Children on November 8, 2023.
- The Adult Choir will meet on November 15, 2023.
- The Worship/Altar Guild Committee met the prior week.
- VINE's caregiver coach Glenda is offering free 15minute individual memory screening appointments on January 3, 2024 @1:00-3:00 p.m.
- Pastor Jan requested pulpit supply on December 3, 2023. Bob made a motion to approve pulpit supply on December 3, 2023. Eileen seconded, and it was unanimously approved. Reverend Broeder will provide pulpit supply.
- Council held discussion regarding a proposal to bestow upon Pastor Bob Broeder the Honorary Designation of Pastor Emeritus.

Continuing Business:

- Council is still looking for a replacement for a choir director. The job description was revised and forwarded to Gustavus Music Department to pass to the music education department.
- Bob will speak to the congregation regarding the Neigh- Major calendar dates: • bor's in Need promotion.
- An ecumenical Thanksgiving service will be held on November 21, 2023 at Zion UCC.

New Business:

- The property insurance report was received. The initial proposed premium for 2024 is \$13,473.11. The accepted premium with policy revisions for 2024 will be \$12,363.94.
- Discussion was held regarding a leadership mini-retreat in February, 2024, to develop a plan to find strengths and needs to be met in the church. Dates will be discussed at future meetings.
- Council discussed staff reviews and salary negotiations as they have not been done since COVID. The Executive Committee will meet and discuss.

Deacons:

Discussion was held regarding the budget development process for 2024. Pledge cards and letters will be mailed out. Encouraged the development of the budget before the Christmas season.

Elders:

Two council positions are up for election in 2024. David and Gail will both have completed six years.

Discussion was held regarding electing versus appointing Christian Education committee members.

Trustees:

- Trustees are still trying to detect the source of the roof water leak.
- Need a replacement for a licensed boiler operator.. HVAC has been shut down and the boiler has been started.
- Trustees to inquire with other churches regarding chemicals for the boiler.

Committee Reports: The Altar Committee met and have dates scheduled for setting up Christmas decorations.

Other Business:

- Discussion was held regarding Christmas Eve services in 2023 as it is on a Sunday. Bob made a motion to have only two services on Christmas Eve. The Fourth Advent Service will be held Christmas Eve morning at 9:00 a.m. The second service will be held on Christmas Eve at 5:30 p.m. Bill seconded, and the motion was unanimously approved.
- Discussion was held regarding the Christmas offering designation. One-half of the amount will go to the Christmas Fund "Veterans of Cross." David will speak with Molly Thelemann who facilitated our donation offering to children in the local school district. Council will discuss the matter further at the December council meeting.
